In 1968 I was on this mountaintop (photo) in South Vietnam, when I received the news of Dr. King's death. I later asked the Lord why was I in Vietnam when Dr. King was assassinated. God's reply was, "I have preserved you, because we must do it again." I said, "WHAT LORD, a march of Freedom?" The "Let Freedom Ring" has been done.

In order for freedom to ring, it is vitally important that everyone knows who they

are, where they fit into the whole and their function.

This is an important principle in every walk of life including God and the military. They must not be confused about the branch of service in which they serve. I was in the Airborne Infantry Division of the United States Army; dedicated to their mission regardless to what the mission may be. We must celebrate who we are and receive the proper identification. Each branch of the military have their own command, order and unit of assignment at different levels. Every soldier must know and understand their Commander and Chief, his representatives and the Chain of Command. One must receive the representative as receiving the Commander and Chief.

What is a command? A command is the authority that is given to a Commander. Authority must be exercised in order for sovereignty to be released and to accomplish the purpose within the command. All are called to serve in the command, but not all are called to command. The following are elements of command:

(1) the Commander (2) the recipient(s) (3) the action(s)

Within the elements there must be an attitude of command and that is a willingness to be:

(1) instructed (2) willingness to change to benefit (3) willing to be loyal and faithful (4) willing to endure within until the end of the required time of the assignment.

Within the command are training requirements to establish and maintain a standard of preparedness for the mission of the command. Training requirements are established according to the command's mission statement.


Such a system would have a two fold mission; making profits, and also improving lives of those who dont fully benefit from today's market forces.


This new approach requires a whole new approach to education and science - an approach that focuses on the increase development of people and notjust products.


